## Layout of Workshop Description

## Workshop on Anti-Corruption

**TARGET GROUP** | Officials in members states responsible for anticorruption prevention and enforcement. At least three years of related experience in anticorruption prevention and enforcement is desired. The current job or responsibilities at work should be linked to the topic of the workshop.

**DESCRIPTION** | The 4-day hybrid workshop will be comprised of (i) a general introductory lecture, followed by four modules: (ii) corrupt systems and corrupt transactions; (iii) core principles of effective anticorruption strategies and institutions, (iv) core principles of effective anticorruption laws, and (v) adaptive leadership challenges of anticorruption reform within systems captured or affected by corruption. A short recap session will close the workshop. Participants are expected to engage, share their experience and may be asked to make brief interventions. Peer learning and experience-sharing will be an essential element of the workshop.

**OBJECTIVES** | Upon completion of this workshop, participants should be able to:

- Understand the cross-cutting nature of corruption, its impact on governance, economic growth, and macro-economic stability/performance.
- Understand the need to prepare and promote tailor-made and sequenced preventive and enforcement strategies and anti-corruption tools.
- Interact and collaborate in shared communities of interest and learning.
- Achieve a common understanding on anticorruption frameworks, core concepts, and underlying drivers of corruption.
- Make best use of typical approaches and tools to identify and address corruption vulnerabilities.
- Identify the core principles that should inform effective anticorruption strategies, laws, and institutions.
- Use adaptive leadership tools to lead anticorruption efforts effectively.
